

3. ANTIPAS² NEWMAN (1627-1672) contains 41 documented town entries on 10 pages, 4 pages on his estate inventory and issues, and GS inscriptions. References to Judge Sewall and a story of Thomas² Bowen and Antipas going to visit Gov Winthrop in Connecticut.

- iii. FITZ-SAMUEL.
- iv. SAMUEL, born 1666, died at Barbados before 28 Sept 1698. Two pages of story on him.
- vi. SYBEL, born 1670 and married John Edwards. Two pages of life events and a brief summary of their 9 children (just names and birth dates).
- vii. WAITSTILL, born 1671 and died in England before 1694. Contains a letter from Wait Winthrop detailing Wait Newman's illness.

13. DR. JOHN³ NEWMAN (1660-1719/20) married RUTH EMERSON. He was a physician and justice of the peace. She was the granddaughter of deputy Governor Samuel Symonds.¹ The section contains 12 pages of documented events, letters to John Winthrop, Jr. and other stories.

14. i. JOHN³.

- iii. ANNE. (1693-1736) Married Dr David⁴ Palmer. Provides names and birthdates of 6 children.

14. JOHN⁴ NEWMAN (1686-) married MARY MARSHALL (Cotton Mather officiating). Contains a deposition of a court case (corn issues), and several letters.

- ii. REV JOHN⁵ NEWMAN (1715-1763). Six pages of details and comment "with his death the male line of Antipas² Newman became extinct.
- iii. SAMUEL⁵(1722-1723).
