

PATIENCE² NEWMAN (1629-1690) married Nathaniel Sparhawk 3 Oct 1649. He was the son of Deacon Nathaniel¹ Sparhawk of Cambridge and a Deacon at their Church (he was a significant land owner in Cambridge: five houses and 500 acres of land.). Nathaniel² would be Deacon of the same Church.

Note: the manuscript uses Arabic numbering system but I am using roman per the template.

- i. NATHANIEL³ (1650-1651).
- ii. MARY³. (1652-1673).
- iii. SYBIL³. (1655-1708) married twice: Dr Jonathan Avery, Rev. Michael Wigglesworth. Describes 4 children with first husband and 1 with second. Lengthy obit of son Rev. Edward Wigglesworth (1692-1765) who was a Fellow of Harvard and Hollis Professor of Divinity. It mentions that his only surviving daughter is “married to Mr. Sewall, lately chosen HANCOCK Professor of Hebrew and other oriental languages.”
- iv. ESTHER³ (1661-SURVIVED HER FATHER).
- v. SAMUEL³ (1664-1713). Married Sarah Whiting, daughter of Rev. Joseph Whiting of Lynn, Mass. Briefly describes their 7 children.
- vi. NATHANIEL³ (1667-1734). Married Abigail Gates. Briefly describes his 4 children.
- (a) vii. JOHN³

(A) REV. JOHN³ SPARHAWK (1672-1718). Was born at Cambridge and died at Bristol. Five pages of details and many footnotes and another reference to him in Judge Samuel Sewall’s diary. There are a set of complex marriages outlines here. He married, first, Elizabeth Poole of Boston (I believe he writes she is the grand daughter of Gov William and Elizabeth Brenton of Rhode Island). He married second Priscilla (Waldron) Hayman. Priscilla would marry Jonathan Waldo (and the marriages go on and on).

- i. REV. JOHN⁴ (~1713-1755). He married “at Major Sewall’s house at Boston” Jane Porter, daughter of Rev. Aaron and Susannah (Sewall) Porter, of Medford, Mass and granddaughter of Maj. Stephen Sewall, brother of Judge Samuel Sewall. Transcribes a sonnet from Judge Samuel Sewall to Rev John Sparhawk on the birth of his son in 1713. Briefly describes their 13 children.
- ii. COL. NATHANIE⁴ (1715-ABOUT 1789). MARRIED ELIZABETH PEPPERRELL AT KITTERY, MAINE. DESCRIBES THEIR 7 CHILDREN IN A FAIR AMOUNT OF DETAIL. CHILD 3 IS “(B) WILLIAM PEPPERRELL.”

(B) WILLIAM PEPPERRELL⁵ SPARHAWK (1746-1816). Married Elizabeth Royall. There are nine pages of details in here. On page 33c it lists their four children “surname Pepperrell, born at Kittery Maine.” I think the surname should be Sparhawk, so I need to spend some time to resolve this issue.

- i. ELIZABETH ROYAL (1769-1813). Married Henry Hutton. Describes their 10 children.
- ii. MARY HIRST MCINTOSH (1771-1839). Married Sir William Congreve.
- iii. HARRIET (1773-1848). Married Charles Thomas Hudson. Describes their six children.
- iv. WILLIAM ROYAL (1775-1809). He died unmarried at the Isle of Wight and is says “with his death the baronetcy [defined as “the rank of Baron”] was inherited by no other member of the family and became extinct.”
